## TWISTING HISTORY – and – HISTORY REPEATING ITSELF

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It has been proven by the ONLY COMPLETE series of official records that exist that a decrease in smallpox **mortality** coincided with a decrease in smallpox vaccination.

- During the forty-five years of the Registration of deaths and their causes, smallpox mortality has very slightly diminished, while an exceedingly severe smallpox epidemic occurred within the last twelve years, since the introduction of compulsory vaccination
- There is no evidence to show that the slight decrease of smallpox mortality is due to vaccination.
- The severity of smallpox was not mitigated by vaccination.
- Several infectious diseases increased to an alarming extent coincidently with enforced vaccination.
- Often, if a person's pox marks covered the vaccination site, they were counted among the unvaccinated even if they had received the vaccine.
- We have no reason for crediting the decrease in smallpox to vaccination. In fact on three separate occasions a considerable increase in vaccinations was followed by an increase in smallpox outbreaks and an increase in smallpox mortality. (p9)

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1880 – the Register-General reports that "figures show conclusively that *coincident with the gradual increase of vaccination there has been a gradual and notable decline in the mortality from smallpox in all ages.* 

The REAL statistics show that it is the exact opposite: **Each increase in vaccination caused an increase in mortality**. And the registration records show that the proportion of the population vaccinated is much less than usually reported. (footnote, pg 9).

1806: total number of cases BEFORE vaccination became available: 24,994 1857: total number of cases AFTER vaccination became available: 48,451

2017 – "By 1897, the numbers of smallpox cases had decreased sharply as a result of vaccination and outbreak control." TEXTBOOK: Vaccines: by Plotken et al, p.719

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1880: "There is nothing to show that the increase in vaccinations had any effect on the infection, which ran its course and died out like other epidemics."

2001: Dr. Tom Mack: "Even without mass vaccination, smallpox would have died out anyway. It was already on its way out. It just would have taken a little longer."

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1836-51 and 1870-80: Actual records from the London Smallpox Hospital Reports showed that the average rate *of death among the vaccinated* was 18.8%

1872: "Looking at the first two years of life, smallpox death rate is actually *lower for the unvaccinated* (41%) than for the vaccinated (57%) in infants, and equal for all other ages (13%) (p 33)

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"...The rich harvest of money accruing from the practice, therefore, became a powerful motive for its defense. Legislators and boards of health enforced the perpetuation of the system. It gave lucrative employment to a class whose self-interest prompts them to use every type of subterfuge and special pleading to perpetuate compulsory vaccination legislation.... It is hard to alter the ideas of people after they have crystallized into habit."

1797: "Vaccination came so nearly a religious rite that christening and vaccination of a child was performed on the same day." (pg 25)

1882: The first details of 478 cases of smallpox vaccination spread syphilis. "When these facts are realized by a much crucified and long suffering public, it will not take long to put a stop to the compulsory feature of this infamous crime. We shall no longer submit the bodies of our defenseless children to the assaults of salaried, place-hunting doctors or longer tolerate the flagrant usurpations of parliaments and legislatures over our personal liberties and sacred family circle. (p 24)

1897: "The introduction of inoculation of mineral or vegetable poisons into the blood is hazardous and in certain quantities may be destructive; but the introduction of animal products from another living body, be it man, a cow or even an ass [donkey/horse], is infinitely more pernicious." (p 25)

1900: "The inoculation superstition was the chief medical curse of the 18<sup>th</sup> century. It sent multitudes to untimely graves and permanently impaired the health of other multitudes since the septic poisoning from within reached the very fountains of life and laid the foundations for long and incurable diseases.
